## Bits & Pieces from Club Manager's Desk

### Social etiquette

Up to the 1960s many parts of Singapore were littered with open area garbage dumps and the dumps were there because the civil service at that time was still grappling with many other priority issues. Only the urban areas had proper sanitary and garbage collection facilities. The outlying kampongs (villages) had to make do with outlying grounds to bury their garbage and human wastes. As all Asian countries were poor, the community's standard of living was also below par. Spitting and littering were the most acceptable practices. Outbreaks of diseases were not uncommon but somehow the people at that time were more resilient against viruses.

Fast forward to 2012 Singapore, the reverse has taken place. Kampongs are completely extinct with only one or two tailor-made for tourists. With education and an efficient state administration taking care of practically everything in our daily lives Singapore has attained a higher standard of living. Golf clubs in the old days were the domain of the rich and famous and being rich and famous would probably mean that some standards of decorum were required. Today, golf club membership is open to a wide spectrum of people regardless of race, language or religion, business or salary people, educated or semi literate and so on. With such a motley group of members, clubs can expect a little erosion in social etiquette and

die-hard habits like spitting, littering, smoking, laying bath towels on the floor to clean their feet, pilfering of items from the changing room and so on.

The club's staff are there to meet the conveniences of all members and members are respectfully reminded to co-operate by keeping their bad habits out of the club. This is your club and members' behavior would ultimately chart the club's social status among the peers.

### Resumption of reciprocal arrangement with Sembawang Golf Club.

With effect from Tuesday 6 March 2012, CGC members will be able to play the new 9-hole course on Tuesdays – Fridays ( excl public holidays) for one morning flight and one afternoon flight. Three days advance booking is required and bookings must be made through CGC Golfing office. Buggy use is compulsory and twin-sharing buggy fee is \$24 ( subjected to GST) per golfer. Golfers must possess valid handicap index.

CGC members, as guests, are reminded to observe the host club's Rules and Bye-laws.

### CCTV system at #345

A CCTV system with two infra-ray cameras have been installed at #345 for added security to club properties. One camera will capture the vehicles' bag drop entrance and another camera will capture the golf bag rack area.

## News from Greens & Handicap Sub-Committee

### Sutera Harbour, Marina Golf Country Club, Kota Kinabalu, Sabah

With effect from 16 February 2012, golfing reciprocal privileges are been extended to Changi Golf Club. CGC members will pay SHMGCC member's rate for a 18-hole game. Buggy use is compulsory. Accommodation at The Pacific Sutera Hotel and The Magellan Sutera Hotel within the Sutera Harbour Resort Development, is 20% off the best available rates.

Golf bookings must be made through CGC Golfing Office at least 7 days in advance.

### Buggy On Track & Roped Up Areas

Golfers are reminded to observe the buggy on track and roped up area instructions. These precautionary measures are taken to ensure that our fairways, especially on wet days, are not damaged by the buggy traffic. Golfers must not release the ropes from the stakes and drive the buggies into the fairways.

Marshals will be on the lookout for golfers who flout the instructions and the Greens Sub-Committee hopes that golfers will co-operate with the ground team to make Changi a better place to golf.
