Safety and you on the course

In 2009, a golfer died after being struck by lightning while playing at TMCC. Following the recent agreement by TMCC to pay damages to the victim's family and to bear their legal costs, it is timely to remind members again that the onus also lies with golfers to stop play immediately and proceed to the nearest shelter when the lightning siren warning is activated.

CGC has been using a lightning warning system for many years and lately has also engaged the good office of Changi Air Base's weather bureau for early lightning detection warnings. While this may sound assuring, any lightning experts will tell you that there is no foolproof lightning detection system.

Ultimately, golfers must play their part by respecting the marshal's instructions, the warning sirens and the unpredictable elements of Mother Nature. It's our lives. Live it or leave it.

Besides lightning risks, golfers should not take their medical health for granted. There have been cases of golfers experiencing breathlessness and heat stroke while on the course. Medical advisories have been posted on the notice boards advising golfers to refrain from physical activity if they are not feeling well.

A tragedy happened some years back at CGC. Two golfers completed nine holes and one of them was observed to be feeling unwell. His playing partner advised him to stop but he insisted on continuing. After both had teed off, this medically unfit golfer collapsed at the 10th green. When the marshal arrived he could not be revived and I was there at the starter's office to witness the untimely death of a golfer who was in his late forties.

News from Greens & Handicap Sub-Committee

Submission of Scorecards if Play is Interrupted by Rain/Lightning

If play is suspended in any session, even for a short period, members are NOT REQUIRED to submit a score card. This applies even if they manage to complete their round.

In such circumstances, there is no penalty for non-submission of cards. If members choose to submit a card, their scores will still be posted.

Interclub game with Jurong Country Club

The away interclub friendly with Jurong Country Club on Saturday 26 May 2012 has been postponed to a date to be advised.

Since 2010, CGC has organized workshops for all staff on providing first aid, including how to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and use an automated external defibrillators (AED). In March 2012, the SCDF also conducted a workshop on first aid and fire safety for all CGC personnel, including the restaurant's staff.

With such training, club employees are better equipped to deal with emergencies.
