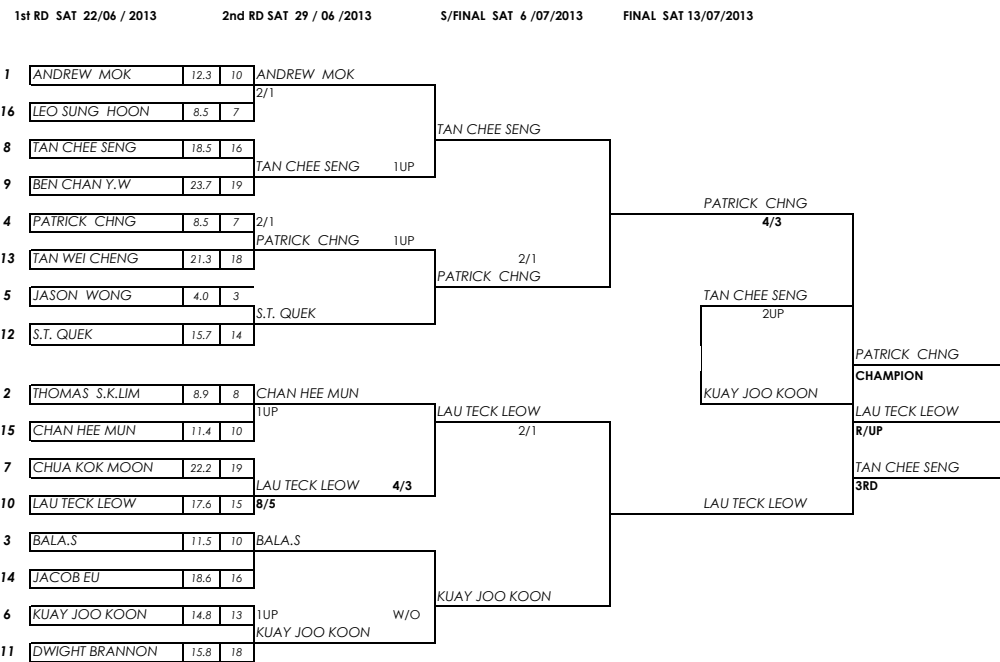
CGC vs Kluang CC Interclub friendly
