Recycling of Plastic Bags

One day, in the men's changing room, I saw this member taking out a crumpled plastic bag from his boston bag. I watched him stuffing his soiled clothes into the plastic bag. I have known this member, whom I shall call TB, I asked TB how long he has been recycling this plastic bag and he replied "For many years."

All golfers are advised that the earthworks on the 5th Hole constitutes Abnormal Ground Conditions and Rule 25-1 applies.

Relief

Except when the ball lies in a water hazard or a lateral water hazard a player must lift the ball and drop it WITHOUT PENALTY, within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief, NO NEARER THE PIN. The nearest point of relief MUST NOT be in a hazard or on a putting green.

If a ball to be dropped is not immediately recoverable or lost in the abnormal ground condition, a ball may be substituted and relief taken as indicated above.

New Software

The Club has upgraded its software which allows members to record their scores without submitting a scorecard. The Peer Review module situated at the counter of the main office can now be used to record scores immediately after play. Simply click on "POST SCORES" follow the instructions to record your gross scores for each hole.

If members record correctly there is NO NEED to submit a scorecard.
