With the uncertainties of global politics we must brace ourselves against any gloomy economic crunch while hoping for the best. The club is no different. We too are feeling the weight of depressed revenues. Members and staff are being challenged to find more innovative ways to increase revenue channels and reduce costs. Club must also look at non-golfing activities to supplement the revenue. Creating wealth through savings is not the end-all solution as savings

would eventually affect the maintenance and services.

The Committees and Management teams are also working hand in hand to control costs. Managing even a small club is no easy task as everything boils down to money. The day may come sooner than expected, that we can no longer hold out on increasing fees that have not been reviewed in a long time. Take the golf bag locker rental fee for instance. Since 1997 the rental fee has remain at \$15 (GST \$16.05). The price of a metal cabinet has increased many folds and the annual rental of the #345 building housing the golfing office and locker rooms has also increased. The golf bag locker is a service convenience especially for members who do not own cars. As the golf bag lockers are housed at the golfing office the fee collection helps to partly defray the monthly rents. Recently the management has recommended to increase the monthly rental fee of the golf bag locker to \$18 (GST \$19.26) wef 1 January 2015. Members using the lockers can use the monthly spending levy (MSL) to offset the fee.

Raising fees are definitely difficult and sensitive issues but it is management's hope that when the time comes, members will continue to extend their understanding and support, for after all this is your club and management has your best interest at heart.

Changi Golf Club's crown jewels are the greens and the 'nineteenth watering hole' with the 'Cinerama' view of the sea channel and the tranquil island of Pulau Ubin. And crown jewels require constant dusting and cleaning to maintain the sparkles. Have you seen golf courses with greens planted with two types of grass? I bet we all have at Changi. I would love to tell you I knew what to do; but no not really. I knew I had to replant the greens. But how? Grass costs money. Sand and other materials cost money. Professional manpower costs money. And we 'money no have' but somehow we still managed to pull something out from the hat.

If you have been to the course during the past six months you would have noticed that three of our greens have undergone grass returfing, from the Bermuda/Zoysia grass to the latest Puspalum grass. The Puspalum grass was a 'gift' from NSRCC and here I must acknowledge the close relationship of the officials and offices of both clubs.

The returfing project is part of a bigger plan to convert all our 12 greens to Puspalum grass for an uniform putting surface. It can be achieved. Nothing is impossible if we have a blank cheque.

Here is interesting news. Older members will remember the 5th tee box on the road level once known as Northolt Road. The small tee box was in

use until the late 80s when it was abandoned and later fenced in by MINDEF. Those times, better endowed players would try to drive the balls across the tree tops along the left slope, when the trees were not that tall, and land the balls around the left dogleg junction. You will be glad to know that the Greens Sub-Committee has plans to recreate a tee box on the road level at the small land parcel by the MINDEF fence. The frangipani tree will be relocated. Some of the trees on the left hand side of the 5th/14th fairway will be crowned or pollarded for the anticipated line of play. When news got out members were excited about this 'competition tee box', meaning that the tee box will only open for play on official competition days.

Some inconveniences were experienced when lorry-loads of earth were back-filling the 4th and 7th fairway slopes. The upgrading project is part of the beautification of the course. Beautification/renovation of the course would include having a theme. Golf courses that have too many trees; whether in term of numbers or of variety must have a landscape theme. Planting coniferous trees besides oil palms is an example of bad landscaping. Excavating grounds to hold water must also have contours pleasing to the eyes. The professionals know best. We are always looking to make our course better. We have a long way to go, but we intend to stay our course and take on the challenges.

A new water cooler machine has been installed at The Turning Point for members to replenish their water bottles with clean cold water. Please do not wash hands and rags at this water point. The wash basin is just round the corner. Do patronize the halfway house's food and drinks. You are the reason why the operator is here.

Encouraging youngsters into the game is critical to the future of the game at club and national level. Take for example, football. The Football Association of Singapore (FAS) who is responsible for the development and advancement of the game at all levels has spread their feelers to schools hoping to influence younger boys and girls to take up the game and create a pool of talented players to feed the national football team. Lack of facilities has always been cited. Decades back, one could kick a football anywhere without worries. Today, in land scarce Singapore, kicking a football anywhere could land one in trouble. Golf is no exception. It is still, to some extent an elitist game. Youngsters whose families are financially-strapped may never see the trees and the fairways. Golf clubs can help to co-opt potential youngsters with training facilities and perhaps a little pocket money for travelling expenses. Do not

bermoan the loyalty of co-opted youngsters who may one day leave the nest and fly away. Forward-looking companies will train their staff to be better workers and in doing so pave a career path for them when they decide to leave for greener pastures. Changi can co-opt potential youngsters into the ranks to represent the club. Changi is already a responsible corporate citizen through charity golf events. There is space for another feather to its corporate cap with the induction of junior non-members.

The Club's initial land lease will expire in 2021 and with the promise of an extended land lease till 2040, it has generated much excitement. The Club needs a team of committed members to form a Club Development Committee (CDC) to suggest, plan and implement the physical redevelopment and bearing in mind of the limited financial resources. This is probably a once in a life time opportunity for members to get involved.

Since the day I called myself a Changian, I have seen many caterers walking in and out of Changi's doors, regardless of the years they served the club. Changi has an enviable environment for dining. All the previous caterers were experienced caterers and yet we are faced with such frustrations. A F&B businessman once told me that he prefers to take chances with the public than with clubs which has too many restrictions and fastidious members, thus creating an unfavorable business climax. The Committee is engaged in getting a 'right F&B operator' to serve the club and during the window period members' understanding is sought.

CountDown or CountUp, this year is a CountOut, giving the club a respite to consolidate their resources for the event in 2016. Members and family who are at the club on 31 December 2014 will be treated to free buffet food from 7pm - 9pm (and while stocks last). Guests will be charged a nominal fee. The Management Committee and Staff wish all members a Happy New Year.

Spring cleaning came early for the general administrative office after the 20-odd year's dirt-smitten floor carpet was replaced with simple vinyl tiles. The staffs are happy that the office environment now is cheery and clinical. Thank you.

Members, impressed with the Singapore Civil Service Club's (SCSC) facilities, have asked about affiliation arrangements. The SCSC management is currently monitoring the patronage patterns of their members
