Bits & Pieces from the Club Manager's Desk

Are we safe?

The Singapore Police (SP) and Singapore Civil Defense Force (SCDF) are embarking on an exercise to engage the public and Singaporeans on the terror threats and security environment that are happening in the international and regional stage and local context.

We are aware of terror attacks on innocent civilians in France, Belgium, Sweden, Russia, UK, Egypt, Iran, Turkey, Malaysia and Indonesia. As reported in the media, Singapore is a prized target and it is a matter of WHEN not IF for a terror strike.

The SP and SCDF are doing a great job in keeping Singapore secured but safety for you, family and friends must come from all of us. The SP and SCDF cannot be everywhere at all times. We must play our part to be the 'eyes and ears' for the enforcement teams.

Changi Golf Club is part of the Safety and Security Watch Group (SSWG) in the Changi area. Together with all the other clubs, hotels, resorts and commercial business enterprises in Changi, we the stake holders must ensure that terrorists and radicalized citizens do not gain an operational foothold here.

At Changi Golf Club we must stay alert for any suspicious person/s loitering within our premises. We must stay alert for any unattended bags and parcels. We must register members who left their vehicles overnight at the club. As our restaurant is open to the public some customers may walk in with bag packs. Regretfully, we are not able to conduct bag check as this would be intrusive and not good from the business angle.

The Marine Police has installed a solar-powered CCTV at the Sunset Terrace to watch the movement of boats and deter illegal immigrations along our shores.

In the event of an attack there will be casualties and we must be equipped to render first aid and CPR to those who need it. Our staffs have gone through the AED/CPR course over the past 6 years and have achieved a certain level of proficiency. This training would come in handy in an eventuality, as the first 4 minutes are crucial for cardiac-arrest victims.

While precautionary measures are in place it is YOU the person on the ground that will make the difference.
