Bits & Pieces from the Club Manager's Desk
Fake News

New laws to regulate Singapore's online space and tackle the spread of fake news are expected to be introduced next year, said Law and Home Affairs Minister K Shanmugam on Monday (Jun 19).

Speaking at the start of a two-day forum on news credibility organised by the Straits Times and the World Association of Newspapers and News Publishers (WAN-IFRA), Mr. Shanmugam said consultations with stakeholders such as media professionals on the legal framework will be held in the second half of this year.

Our hand phones have been deluged by doctored images/news of presidents and politicians; some humorous and others not too flattering. Many people can't tell when photos are fake. Such images/news, when seen and read through the eyes of simple minded people may construe as 'breaking news' and being created could spread faster via social media. "And then where it is done with malice or for profit, or deliberately spreading fake news, the authorities have to find ways in which it is dealt with and the people who spread such fake news are also dealt with."

Club members have been using the apps to disseminate their groups' golfing and social activities. We must embrace the new technology but with everyone writing their 'own news' there is likelihood of the original message being hijacked and leaving an on-line trail of confusion. This must be avoided.

Men in Blue After One-armed Bandits

The Singapore Police Force Licensing & Regulatory Department is conducting an exercise requiring

all business organisations and clubs that operate jackpot machines to apply for new licencing. This SPF exercise, in my opinion, is the result of recent newspapers' report of the huge jackpot machines' revenue generated and accumulated by a so-called football club. As we are aware, the SPF has very strict rules and regulations on anything involving gaming. I envisage the closure of many jackpot machines operations island-wide after the new rules and regulations kick in.

Drink Driving

"CJ sets out new sentencing guide for drink driving. ST 29 July 2017"

Drink drivers who injure someone or damage property should expect to serve time in jail, save in an exceptional category of cases. The CJ stressed that the very purpose of criminalising drink driving is to prevent harm to others. "Drink driving has many potential consequences – such as disruption of traffic, fear and alarm to pedestrians and other drivers, damage to public and private properties, and detrimental to the drunk driver's own well-being – but at the very pinnacle of the potential harm is physical injury or death of those who are put in harm's way by the drunk drivers conduct", explained CJ Menon.

Criminalising drink driving is long overdue.

When the RAF handed Changi Golf Club golf course to the government there was no membership base. After the government handed the management of Changi Golf Club to an appointed civilian team there was also hardly a membership base to start with. The civilian team, comprising of volunteers, inherited a golf course and a wooden structure as a club house but no members and no financial resources. The civilian team had to scramble for members – any Dick, Tom or Harry who want to play golf can qualify for a membership costing \$150 back in 1971. An affordable monthly subscription was introduced for club house and golf course operational expenses. 70 years later the membership has enlarged to the current strength and the monthly subscription has increased several folds to meet the rising costs. As a members club

the members are the stakeholders and must contribute their share for its very existence. The club management committee, comprising of members serving in a voluntary capacity, ensures that the club is properly managed in accordance with the rules and by-laws and the set policies and complements an effective club management team for the daily administrative process.

Hole-In-One

There is no difference in managing the club and the funds now and 40 years back. Being a members' club, it is assured of a steady income through subscription but the revenue collected is not enough to pay for staff cost and other upkeep expenses. Operational costs keep rising – upgrading of staff, replacement of machinery and equipment, maintenance of club properties, etc. After all, managing the club is the responsibility of the members and the success of the whole organisation rests with the stakeholders. When club funds are strained the stakeholders have to contribute to the kitty. "Before we think of having fun we must consider where to get the fund".

An Update from NParks

Sighting of a crocodile at Changi Beach Park. On 21 August 2017, a crocodile was sighted at Changi Creek, near Changi Point Ferry Terminal. It was likely to be Estuarine Crocodiles (Crocodylus porosus), which are known to swim freely between the Straits of Johor and Changi Coast. Estuarine Crocodiles feed and rest in mangroves and freshwater bodies, and are usually found in the water or at mudflats away from visitor routes.

For the safety of park users, advisory notices have been put up in the park near water edges. The agencies, including AVA, PCG, PA Water Venture and NYC are monitoring the crocodile sightings along the coasts and are keeping each other updated on new sightings.
